ASSOCIATED WITH AIRCRAFT. HERE'S WHAT PEOPLE IN CLAYTON CO., & ESPECIALLY OUR FAMILY IN THE FLAT ROCK COMMUNITY, HAD TO SAY ABOUT THE AIRPORT IN 1917-1918. "NEWSPAPER 3, CORNER STOREKEEPERS, BARBERS AND BACKYARD GOSSIPS WERE ALL TALKING ABOUT THE WAR IN EUROPE AND ABOUT THE LITTLE CLEARED PLACE IN THE COTTON FIELD BEHIND THE CHURCH WHERE "AIRSHIPS" LANDED AND TOOK OFF. EVEN THEN THE AIRPORT WAS A NUISANCE TO THE COMMUNITY. THE FARMERS SAID THAT THE PLANES SCARED THE CHICKENS AND CAUSED THE MULES TO RUN AWAY."
 IN THE 1950'S THE ATLANTA AIRPORT WAS VERY OFTEN CALLED "CANDLER FIELD" AFTER ASA CANDLER OF COCA-COLA FAME & EARLY AVIATION SUPPORTER. WE'RE RELATED TO ASA CANDLER THROUGH Y.S. & BETSEY (ANTHONY) ALLEN (SEE L.L.'s NOS. 5 & 29, L.D.6) BUT I DON'T KNOW THE DEGREE OF KINSHIP. (THE ESSENTIAL PORTION OF THE ABOVE APPEARS AT TOP OF MAP, *md*)

16 LEANDER C. H'ISON HOUSE, BUILT IN 1879, & ONE MILLION (1,000,000) HAND-MADE BRICKS WERE USED IN THE CONSTRUCTION & THE EXTERIOR WALLS ARE 12 INCHES THICK. HAS BEEN RESTORED & STANDS AT 144 COLLEGE ST. (6) NOTE: ON 31 MAY, 2014, LEE HUTCHESON 10th GR'N SON OF LEANDER H'ISON, TOLD ME THAT AN OLDERMAN (PROB. JIM WATTERSON) TOLD HIM 3094 SOLDIERS (CONFEDERATE) ARE BURIED IN THE NINE CORNER OF THIS PROPERTY. *md*

17 LEANDER C. H'ISON'S BLACKSMITH SHOP. BURNED & DESTROYED BY KILPATRICK'S UNION CAVALRY CA. 19 AUG., 1864. THE R.R. DEPOT & NUMEROUS OTHER BLDGS. BURNED DURING THIS SAME RAID.



19 JONESBORO JAIL, ALSO BURNED (IT WAS OF WOOD CONSTRUCTION) DURING KILPATRICK'S CAVALRY RAID. IN 1867, A NEW JAIL, BUILT OF BRICK, WAS CONSTRUCTED. LEANDER C. H'ISON WAS SHERIFF WHEN THE JAIL WAS BURNED IN 1864. MUST'VE BEEN A ROUGH DAY FOR 44 YR. OLD LEANDER WHEN HE SAW BOTH HIS BLACKSMITH SHOP & JAIL GO UP IN SMOKE.

20 1864 R.R. DEPOT. REPLACED IN 1865 (?) BY A BRICK JAIL ^{DEPOT WHICH IS} ~~WHICH IS~~ STILL STANDING. HOUSES THE MUSEUM "ROAD TO TARA".

21 HOTEL, JONESBORO. IN 1900, JULIA (SIMS) H'ISON, WIFE OF LEANDER CARRUTH H'ISON, WAS LISTED IN THE U.S. CENSUS AS A "HOTEL KEEPER". NAME OF THIS HOTEL, YR. OF CONSTRUCTION & WHETHER THIS BLDG. IS STILL STANDING, I DON'T KNOW. LEANDER & JULIA, BY THE WAY, WERE HALF UNCLE & AUNT TO US ALTHOUGH WE ARE BLOOD-KIN TO LEANDER SINCE HIS FATHER, FURNY H'ISON, WAS A 36 GR'FATHER TO YOU, JOY. BY 1910, JULIA WAS 78 & WASN'T LISTED AS A "HOTEL KEEPER". LEANDER'S BIOLOGICAL MOTHER WAS A WOMAN WHOSE SURNAME WAS REYNOLDS. SINCE LEANDER WAS BORN IN BLOUNT CO., TENN., THIS IS PROBABLY WHERE THE REYNOLDS LADY LIVED. IN 1837, LEANDER HAD HIS NAME LEGALLY CHANGED FROM REYNOLDS TO HUTCHESON

22 OLD REX MILL, L.L. 135, L.D. 12 (A.L.). THIS OLD MILL IS STILL STANDING NEAR THE BANKS OF BIG COTTON INDIAN CR. IN THE OLD "DOWNTOWN" SECTION OF REX. IN THE TEXT ON THE MAP I WROTE THAT THIS MILL BEGAN OPERATION IN THE 1890'S BUT HAVE SINCE LEARNED THAT THIS MILL WAS IN OPERATION YRS. EARLIER, POSSIBLY AS EARLY AS CA. 1860. "OLD REX MILL" CORN MEAL WAS SOLD IN MANY ATLANTA-AREA GROCERY STORES & I CAN RECALL SELLING IT
